What the Buddha taught for little ones like us



One day Bimsara was playing with his friends in their garden. Suddenly, Bimsara came running to his house scouting; "Mother...! Mother...! where are you.... There is a cobra in the garden. Mother ...! Come quickly...!."

Mother got alarmed when she heard Bimsars's shouting. She quickly went to the Grden where Bimsara and his friends were playing. And she saw that Bimsara's friends were throwing stones at a creature.

"Children... do not hurt animals. Let me see it. No children, this is not cobra, this is a rat-snake. These creatures are helpless and innocent. We must let them go on their own. Even cobras or vipers must not be provoked.

Aunty, I have heard Siyathu uncle saying that these poisonous serpents should be killed upon seeing.

"Oh Damith, that is very wrong, There are ways to live without getting hurt even from a poisonous serpent, There are to live without getting hurt even from a poisonous serpent. You do know the sacred Piruvana book don't; you? In that, there is a paritta called *Khanda Paritta*. If you chant that *Khanda* Paritta daily, you would not be hurt by an animal or any poisonous serpent. Those stanzas have amazing powers."

One day when the Buddha was going to the city Savatti, He saw a group of children making a big commotion. The Buddha went near them to see what they were doing. "Ha ha! Children... What are you doing?" The Buddha asked.

"Dear Load Buddha, these serpents should not be allowed to go free.. They sting us," said the children.

"Children, may I ask you a question? Do you like it if someone beats you with clubs, or if anyone hurts you?"

"Oh no, Not at all ... If that happens, we will run home and tell our parents".







STEALING IS A BAD HABIT

We do not like people who take our things without telling us. When we get use to the habit of taking things without the knowledge of the owner, later we may take valuable items too and gradually, we become thieves.

Once upon a time, there was a woman who lived with her only son. Father was dead and she had to work hard to earn a living as was no one to help her. Mother loved her son and did not want to hurt him even for a wrong thing thinking that he might get hurt.

The young son, got into all sort of bad habits as there was no one to advise him or correct him. He did not study or learn any skill, to earn a living. Therefore he started stealing things from others. Eventually everyone came to know that he is not a good man, but a thief, who steal valuable things from others. Once he was captured by officers of law while engaged in wrong activities. He was brought before the Judge and Judge found him guilty. Judge ordered him to be killed.

Just before his death, he told the officers that he need to fulfill his last wish. That was to see his mother. So the

mother was brought to see him. Mother was very sad about the son, but at the same time, she felt happy thinking that her son thought of her before his death. 



Her husband was dead when the son was very small. So she had to bring up the boy, without any assistance from anybody. They didn't have any wealth either. Brothers or parents too did not want to help this poor woman as they thought, that she has brought bad luck to the family.

She was miserable and thought of finding some work as she had to bring up the child. She was able to find some work. She made string hoppers and sold them to the nearest boutique, so she was able to look after the child. Although she could not earn much, what she got was enough for her and her son.
